## Metuchen's Sales Gap: \$167 Million in Opportunities

Have you ever stopped and thought about how the local economy in the Metuchen area will evolve in the 21st century?

Consider that:

- •Middlesex County's population will grow by almost 7 percent between 2010-2020, outpacing the state's overall projected growth rate of about 5 percent.
- •More than 2,800 people work within a quarter-mile radius of Main and New Streets, making downtown Metuchen the largest workforce in the borough and one of the largest in the county?
- •Metuchen has an overall sales gap of approximately \$167 million. That's how much more shoppers within the area are spending outside the borough than in it.

•Only 11.5 percent of downtown Metuchen's business entities are retail businesses, compared with 15-18 percent in other towns.

•The district has a lower percentage of businesses in the "arts, entertainment and recreation" category than is usually found (only 2 percent.)

These findings from the ongoing market assessment commissioned by the Metuchen Downtown Alliance substantiate that there are real opportunities for businesses in the district.

The MDA's marketing consultant concludes that there are "numerous opportunities to attract sales from customers living within the five-minute drive time radius." This is especially true in the categories of furniture and home

furnishings, and food services and drinking places, where downtowns traditionally tend to do well, but there are possibilities in other categories as well.

The assessment suggests that there are also opportunities to attract customers from the broader region.

Achieving this may mean adjusting the goods and services offered to highlight unique qualities and experiences, and possibly building clusters of businesses that together would attract customers interested in comparison-shopping. Not simple but certainly doable for "brainy borough" businesses willing to seize the opportunities.

#### Flower Power!

New flower planters are arriving to replace older pots in the downtown. The older planters will be relocated to other areas of Metuchen.

The Garden Club has organized to order the plants and facilitate planting. The new planters will be self-watering to help keep the mini-gardens blooming all season. Since there are more pots than before, extra volunteers will be needed.

This is a collaborative project with the Garden Club and the MDA's Design Committee.
