#### **Promotion Team**

- Debrief on Restaurant Week reported over \$250,000 in sales including several first-time customers. Marketing campaign generated impressive numbers on multiple platforms.
- Non-restaurant businesses had offerings during Restaurant Week including Newmarket and King Strength.

## **Communications Team**

Dan Cea reported:

- The Restaurant Week Communication push was very successful.
  - AdMessenger 66k impressions, 2,260 people clicking through them, which is a 3.41% click-through rate (highest yet)
  - We did a heavy social media push. Our Facebooks reach was up 466% and Instagram was up 556%
  - o Businesses shared our posts or created posts of their own.
  - Restaurant Week video by Brandon boosted for the whole week. We had 25 shares and reached 8000+ people.
  - o Print ads, Criterion Sentinel reached 20,813 people.
  - MDA website received 1,000s of hits a day whereas before it received 100s
- March Video We are going to shoot two Meet the Merchant Videos in March. We are still talking to some businesses to find the right one.
