At our last Annual Meeting, we had been notified that we were contenders for the Great American Main Street Award, and in March we had the distinct honor of bringing that award home. One of only 3 towns in New Jersey to ever have won.

I am thrilled to say we did not waste this opportunity to celebrate the win or use it to elevate Metuchen's Downtown. From a Fun House Celebration in June to billboards that reached commuters from Rutgers to Secaucus to Princeton, we hyped this award big time and, as a result, welcomed many new visitors to the Borough.

2023 was also a year to reevaluate how we do things and consider what needs to happen for a sustainable future. We collaborated with the Borough on many issues, including a more efficient watering system for our planters, holistic parking changes, the Mayor's Concert Series and the Seward Johnson Sculpture Project creating a stronger partnership that yields a better result for residents and visitors alike.

We focused on inclusive events and prioritized movement into businesses. We had the most interactive and robust holiday season that we kicked off with Shop Sip Stroll and we attracted many media outlets. We successfully applied for several grants and transformed a key alleyway that connects to Main Street. And most importantly we attracted a record number of new businesses and have others waiting in the wings for a space.

The trajectory of the Downtown has been nothing short of remarkable. After spending my first full year here, I can confidently state that this is a testament to the extraordinary commitment of volunteers, business owners, property owners, and the Borough all working together, prioritizing the revitalization of the district and making magic happen.

When we ended last year, we wondered how we could possibly top 2023? And then Jersey Best awards us the Destination of 2024! So we have work to do. We will get ready once again to welcome a new flock of visitors that may not have even known we existed, and I know that once they come that first time, they will return again and again.

# GRANTS

#### NJ EDA SUSTAIN AND SERVE GRANT

Launched by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA) in December 2020, Sustain & Serve NJ has provided eligible entities with grants to purchase meals from New Jersey-based restaurants that have been negatively impacted by COVID-19 and distribute the meals for free to the community.

Building on the success of 2022, in 2023, MDA Volunteers worked with local restaurants as well as the First Presbyterian Food Pantry and together delivered nearly 30k meals to families and students who are facing food insecurity while generating an additional \$150k of revenue.

#### **OUR SHINING BOROUGH (At Conversation Corner) UPDATE- COMPLETE!**

A 4 x 4 Mosaic was installed on top of a custom, outdoor concrete table. The piece was started in December 2022 by Glass artist Donna Slevin and installed in February. . The table is the centerpiece of the 'Conversation Corner' located at New Street and Center Street in between 2 new benches and planters. The project was made possible by a generous Community Challenge grant from AARP, the MDA and the Borough.



#### The Sculpture Project

Working with the Seward Johnson Foundation and in collaboration with the Borough, the MDA curated the first 3 sculptures to the Downtown. Several more will join these in the coming months. We enhanced the project with sidewalk quotes.
